Structure, governance and management

The charity was established in 1999 by Fife Council employees and was recognised as a Scottish Charity with effect from 12 December 2006. The charity is administered in accordance with the constitution.

The charity is directed by a Management Committee (Trustees). The members of the Management Committee are elected at the Annual General Meeting.

Objectives and activities

The purpose of the charity is to encourage the advancement of citizenship or community development (including rural or urban regeneration and the promotion of civic responsibility, volunteering, the voluntary sector or the effectiveness or efficiency of charities.)

The charity raises funds by means of a payroll lottery and other appropriate activities for distribution to charitable and community groups for the public benefit in the local Government area of Fife, the United Kingdom and elsewhere.

During the year the charity received lottery contributions of £80,763 (2024: £75,430) with winnings paid out of £39,000 (2024: £39,000) . Grants were made during the year of between £230 and £1,584 to various causes, totaling £26,267 (2024: £48,941) for the year. No bank interest was received in the current or previous year.

Financial review

The charity's result for the year was a surplus of £14,290 (deficit 2024: £12,996) with expenditure exceeding income. However, surpluses built up from previous years means unrestricted funds at year end were £32,712 (2024 - £22,713). These balances represent the reconciled bank balance at year end and these may be used for future grant and lottery payments.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Fife Charities Trust

For the Year Ended 31st March 2025

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2025 which are set out on pages 4 to 7.

Respective Responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) 2005 Act and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). The charity's trustees consider that the audit requirements of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts 2006 Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the 2005 Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.
