#### Structure, governance and management

The charity was established in 1999 by Fife Council employees and was recognised as a Scottish Charity with effect from 12 December 2006. The charity is administered in accordance with the constitution.

The charity is directed by a Management Committee (Trustees). The members of the Management Committee are elected at the Annual General Meeting.

#### Objectives and activities

The purpose of the charity is to encourage the advancement of citizenship or community development (including rural or urban regeneration and the promotion of civic responsibility, volunteering, the voluntary sector or the effectiveness or efficiency of charities.)

The charity raises funds by means of a payroll lottery and other appropriate activities for distribution to charitable and community groups for the public benefit in the local Government area of Fife, the United Kingdom and elsewhere.

During the year the charity received lottery contributions of £74,486 with winnings paid out of £39,000. 49 grants were made during the year of between £125 and

£1,390 to various causes, totalling £30,913 for the year. £1000 was received from a club which had closed down. No bank interest was received in the year.

#### Financial review

The charity's result for the year was a surplus of £4318.30 or £4368.30 with income exceeding expenditure. The unrestricted funds represents income received but not yet utilized.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Fife Charities Trust

For the Year Ended 31st March 2017

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2017 which are set out on pages 4 to 6.

Respective Responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) 2005 Act and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). Basis of independent examiner's statement
